# Wandering Flagstaff's Wonders

**Early Morning:** Start your stay in Flagstaff with a visit to the Museum of Northern Arizona, the gateway to understanding the land and peoples of the Colorado Plateau. Two hours or more can easily be spent learning about this magnificent region.

**Late Morning:** Riordan Mansion was a state-of-the-art residence back in 1904, and it's still a premium example of Arts and Crafts architecture today. An Arizona State Historic Park, it's open daily to the public.

**Lunch:** Downtown Flagstaff has lots of great places to shop and enjoy lunch. Stop by the Visitor Center in the historic train depot at 1 East Route 66, where staff can give you the latest on what's happening around town.

**Afternoon:** Take a guided tour of famous Lowell Observatory, a Flagstaff landmark since 1894. See the telescope a Lowell astronomer used to discover the planet Pluto in 1930. Consider an evening return for a closer look at the stars.

**Dinner:** Flagstaff has a great selection of dining and nightlife. Ask any local about his or her favorite place or stop by the Flagstaff Visitor Center for some excellent recommendations.
