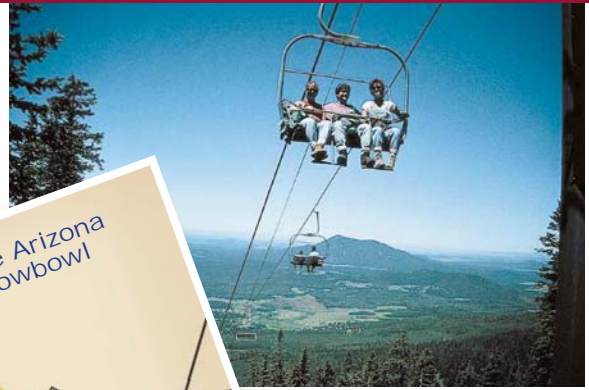
A Day of High Adventure

Morning: Ascend Mt. Humphreys, Arizona's highest mountain at 12,643 feet (3,854 meters), on the Scenic Skyride chairlift. Actually the Arizona Snowbowl's main winter ski lift, the Scenic Skyride operates daily throughout summer and on weekends into fall. The 25-minute ride gains 2,000 vertical feet (610 meters) for spectacular panoramic views at 11,500 feet (3,505 meters) and offers a peek across Northern Arizona at the Grand Canyon.

Lunch: Snowbowl makes a great place for lunch, with good food and plenty of outdoor seating in a wonderful alpine environment.

Afternoon: With miles of trails and more than 2,500 species of plants, The Arboretum at Flagstaff is a great place to learn about the natural side of Northern Arizona. And don't miss the Birds of Prey program including both "on-the-fist" and free-flight demonstrations. Later, visit a few of Flagstaff's many antique shops and stores featuring works by Native American and other local artists.

Dinner: Try a new restaurant tonight, but get home early. Tomorrow is your "big" trip.
